M. Stéphane L'HOST informed me that His Excellency, Monsieur Mitterand, has asked you to review the matter of the above captioned statuette and I want to assure you that you will have our full cooperation in this matter.

Our interest in this matter is simply to honor the memory of the late Chanoine Etienne Drioton, a giant of Egyptology and long time family friend. Madame Noblecourt, one of the greatest Egyptologists of all times, who had been familiar with the Amarna artifacts, since her excavation days in Egypt, had suggested the gift to the Louvre. As is the policy of the Louvre, she had the authenticity of the artifact confirmed by the laboratoires des Musées Nationaux.
